SECTION V - HEALTH HAZARD DATA

EFFECTS OF OVEREXPOSURE: ACUTE: Irritation of eyes and skin may occur with overexposure. Continued breathing of vapors may irritate respiratory tract causing headache, nausea and dizziness.  
CHRONIC: None known.  
EMERGENCY FIRST AID PROCEDURES: INHALATION: Remove to fresh air. Restore respiration if necessary. Treat symptomatically.  
EYE CONTACT: Flush immediately with copious quantities of water for 15 minutes minimum. Consult a physician if irritation persists.  
DERMAL CONTACT: Wash affected areas with soap and water. Remove contaminated clothing. Wash clothing before use. Consult physician if irritation persists.  
INGESTION: Drink 1 or 2 glasses of water to dilute. DO NOT INDUCE VOMITING. If spontaneous vomiting occurs keep head at or below knee level to prevent aspiration into lungs. Consult physician. PRIMARY ROUTES OF ENTRY: Inhalation and dermal contact. AVOID CONTAMINATION OF FOOD
